## Forget to Close your Garage Door?

If the homeowner is in the garage when the timer is set to activate, a built-in beeper and LED flashing light will activate to alert the homeowner in the event they would like to bypass the system.

"This easy-to-install system provides homeowners with increased garage security. The great thing about this product is its simplicity; homeowners can easily parallel their existing wall button with the Garage Door Closer, without additional wiring, a power supply or the use of batteries,” added Tsui.
